


- 1. Colour in each of the images on the template and carefully cut them out.

Sylvie lives in a school in France. Her father is the principal, and her home is an apartment at the end of a hallway of classrooms. Sylvie becomes aware of her parents' conflicts, the complexities of shifting friendships, and what it means to be the only Jewish family in town. 

Can this super hero-in-the-making use his fishy powers to save the day?


